

Each year more than 99% of our traditional students receive financial aid and endowment scholarships are an important part of that package.








2000



PREPARING THE WAY with Endowments

Endowments are vital to any university as it prepares the way for the future. In simplest terms, an endowment is one or more gifts that are invested for the future with a small portion used each year to support a specific need, such as scholarships or academic programs.

Annually, Concordia University awards tens of millions of dollars in financial aid to our students in order to make the uncommon Concordia experience possible. A portion of that aid comes from endowments that have been established over decades. Without these endowments, many students would find the Christ-centered education that Concordia provides out of their reach. Your support of an existing endowment or the establishment of a new endowment helps prepare the way for countless students to come.

Within the overall endowment at Concordia, there are more than 515 individually named funds. These are often established by a family to create an enduring legacy or by a group of supportive friends or alumni. Here are just a few examples.

- The Concordia Bible Institute Saleska Scholarship Endowment honors the work of the Rev. John Saleska, PhD, and provides financial aid to future pastors. This endowment has been supported by individuals as well as congregations and other organizations.
- The Rev. Dr. Paul and Dorothea Foelber Scholarship Endowment supports students with a music major who are planning to become teachers. Doc Foelber served the CUAA campus for many years and, now in his mid-90s, still loves to hear about our students and how he can help them reach their goals.

Alumni Association endowments have been established on each of our two campuses and provide a convenient way for alumni to support their alma mater and prepare the way for the next generation of Concordians.

Whether you support one of the more than 515 existing endowments or establish one in your own name and create an enduring legacy, you are making a gift that will bless students for generations to come.

Endowments can be funded with a current gift, a series of gifts over a period of several years, or funded through an estate gift. Funding is flexible as is your desired area of support.
