REL201: OLD TESTAMENT

Course Overview: This course is an overview of the Old Testament intended to acquaint the student with its background, content, and messages. The introductory course satisfies the core curriculum requirement for Bible content, but students who take it must also take REL203 New Testament elsewhere in their program. It is required for students in a church-work program. I 3 credits

Grading:

Shared discussions 75% Written assignments 25%

Attendance:

Attendance is recorded for each discussion or assignment that is submitted. Students are encouraged to log on about 4 times per week and dedicate about 6 hours each week to their coursework.

Required text: Students will need a study bible. The *Lutheran study bible* is recommended. A contemporary translation such as the New International Version or the English Standard Version is expected.

Assignments: This course has eight units which consist of:

- Units 1-7: two weeks each
- Unit 8: one week

Each unit involves readings from the Bible and other texts, three discussion questions to be shared with others, and five responses to questions that are shared with the instructor.

Shared discussions: Posted answers should be 7-8 sentences. Replies to the posts of others should be about 4 sentences in length.

Written assignment questions: There are five private discussion questions for each unit which are read only by the instructor. These are to be 4-5 sentences each.



15 week course

Not self-paced; assignments Have weekly deadlines.



Students can access their course any time, from any location.

A laptop or desktop is recommended.



Students will set up a university email & use this while in the course.

Orientation will be required prior to the start of the course.

COURSE SCHEDULE

There is extensive reading in the Old Testament, so it's important to be keeping up and planning accordingly each week. It's recommended to be responding to discussion questions early in the week, as this gives students the opportunity to reflect and respond appropriately. Participating in the discussions often will help keep you engaged.
